ORDINANCE NO. 710 series of 2021

AN ORDINANCE REQUIRING THE INSTALLATION OF CCTV CAMERAS IN COMMERCIAL ESTABLISHMENTS WITH SUBSCRIBED CAPITAL OF ONE MILLION PESOS AND ABOVE AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR NON- COMPLIANCE

WHEREAS, Article II Section 5 of the 1987 Constitution provides xx " The maintenance of peace and order the protection of life, liberty, and property, and the promotion of the general welfare are essential for the enjoyment by all the people of the blessings of democracy";

WHEREAS, RA 7160, Section 16 grants local government units to exercise its police power for the general welfare of its people;

WHEREAS, prevention of crime such as robbery and theft is priority program of the Municipal Government of Taytay;

WHEREAS, the Rules on Evidence promulgated by the Supreme Court of the Philippines and jurisprudence interpreting it recognizes object evidence as the highest form of evidence in the practice of litigation, and would therefore assist the prosecution service in prosecuting crimes and the public attorney's in defending the innocent in criminal litigation;

WHEREAS, the market value of CCTV cameras show that certain model can be purchased for (Php 15,000.00) thus not severely impairing the commercial establishments capital.

NOW THEREFORE, be It ordained by the council of Municipality of Taytay In regular session assembled.

Section 1. Definition of Terms

1. Commercial Establishments - any building, structure and establishment or edifice and the life owned and/or operated by entities engaged in trade or business for profit;
2. Compliance Inspection - Inspection conducted by the Municipal Engineer and the BPLO to monitor and ensure compliance with the provisions of this ordinance;

Section 2. Scope of Application - This ordinance shall be applicable to all new and existing business establishment as requirement to secure business permit to (BPLO) Business Permit and Licensing Office of the Municipality of Taytay, Rizal.

Section 3. Coverage - All commercial establishments in the Municipality of Taytay whether or not its principal office is located within the Municipality shall comply with the provisions of this ordinance, provided that the capitalization of said commercial establishment is One Million Pesos (Php 1,000,000.00) as reported in the Business Permit and Licensing Office of the Municipality of Taytay

Section 4. Compliance

- a. New corporations operating or conducting business through any commercial establishment in the municipality falling within the coverage as stated in Section 3 of this ordinance shall submit a report to the Business Permit and Licensing Office detailing the number and placement of its CCTVs in its commercial establishments.
- b. Corporation or business applying for renewal in the municipality falling within the coverage as stated in Section 3 of this ordinance shall submit a report to the Business Permit and Licensing Office detailing the number and placement of its CCTVs in its commercial establishments.
- c. The Engineering Office shall conduct the inspection to establish guidelines and parameters for the installation of CCTVs in commercial establishments.
- d. Representatives of the Business Permit and Licensing Office shall conduct unannounced Compliance Inspections during the business days and hours of commercial establishments, not more than once a month.
- e. Violation of any provision of this ordinance shall be reported by the Business Permit and Licensing Office to the office of the Municipal Mayor and the Municipal Administrator.

- f. The Municipal Mayor, shall, with the advice of the Head of the Business Permit and Licensing Office, shall determine whether or not there has been non-compliance with the provisions of this ordinance.
- g. Any appeal thereof shall be made within five (5) calendar days to the Office of the Municipal Mayor. Any penalty imposed by this ordinance or any other law or ordinance shall be suspended until resolution of this appeal.
- h. Minimum of (4) four units functional CCTV must be installed.

Section 5. Coordination with the Municipal Government in Criminal Investigations

The authorities with Court Order conducting an investigation in an area where a business is required to install a CCTV may demand a copy of the CCTV footage upon prior request to the owner.

Section 6. Penalties

- a. 7 days written warning from (BPLO) Business Permit and Licensing Office.
- b. BPLO written warning of 15 days to comply and 3 days suspension shall be imposed.
- c. 30 days of non-compliance shall be imposed the cancellation of Business Permit.


Section 7. Repealing Clause - All ordinances and resolutions, or parts thereof inconsistent with the provisions hereof shall be repealed or modified accordingly.

Section 8. Separability Clause - If for any reasons any provision/s of this ordinance shall be found unconstitutional by component authority, the other provisions/s not so declared to be unconstitutional shall remain valid.

Section 9. Effectivity - This ordinance shall take effect (15) days after its postings in conspicuous places in the Municipality.
