AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTIONS 5 AND 69 OF ORDINANCE NO. 737 SERIES OF 2022 ALSO KNOWN AS THE "TAYTAY, RIZAL CHILDREN'S WELFARE CODE OF 2022" AND INCORPORATING A CHILD PROTECTION POLICY AS PART OF THE ORDINANCE, PROVIDING GUIDELINES FOR IMPLEMENTATION, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

WHEREAS, the Local Government of Taytay, Rizal recognizes the rights of children as enshrined in the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC) and relevant national laws;

WHEREAS, there is a need to strengthen existing policies on child welfare and protection through amendments to specific sections of the Children's Code and the integration of a comprehensive Child Protection Policy;

WHEREAS, Child Protection Policy is a set of guidelines and measures designed to safeguard children from abuse, neglect, exploitation, violence, bullying and other forms of abuse;

WHEREAS, the laws to be included and be part of the Taytay, Rizal Children's Code of 2022 are laws to ensure compliance with current legal mandates and national standards for child protection and welfare;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the 12th Sangguniang Bayan of Taytay, Rizal, in a session duly assembled, that:

Section 1. Amendment of Section 5 Governing Laws - Section 5 of Ordinance No. 737 series of 2022 also known as Taytay, Rizal Children's Code of 2022 is hereby amended and be read as follows:

"Section 5. Governing Laws - The Municipality of Taytay declares support and adherence to international laws, treaties, and agreements related to the protection of children, and hereby adopts them as part of its local laws, policies, and principles. This Code covers all general and special ordinances of this Municipality relating to the welfare of

children and their families. It supports all the national laws and policies for the survival, protection, development, and participation of children and adopts pertinent international treaties and agreements to which the Philippines is a party.

This Code hereby adopts all relevant and enforceable national laws, rules and other regulations, and local ordinances governing children, such as but not limited to:

- Section 2. Amendment of Section 69 ECCD Officer Section 69 of Ordinance No. 737 series of 2022 also known as Taytay, Rizal Children's Code of 2022 is hereby amended and be read as follows:
 - "Section 69. Early Child Care and Development (ECCD) Officer The Municipal Social Welfare and Development Officer (MSWDO) who is also a member of the Council, will serve as the ECCD Officer."
- **Section 3. Incorporation of a Child Protection Policy** A new Article and Section shall be added to Ordinance No. 737 series of 2022 as follows, and the succeeding articles and sections be adjusted accordingly:

Article 17 CHILD PROTECTION POLICY

Section 133. Establishment of a Child Protection Policy

a) The Municipality of Taytay shall adopt a comprehensive Child Protection Policy to prevent and address various forms of child abuse, neglect, exploitation, and violence. This includes, but is not limited to, physical, emotional, and sexual abuse; different forms of neglect such as physical, educational, and emotional neglect; exploitation, including labor, sexual, and online exploitation; bullying, peer violence, and institutional abuse. The policy shall promote the protection, well-being, and development of children, ensuring their safety in all environments.



- b) The Child Protection Policy shall include the following provisions:
 - i. Child Protection Policy Structure Comprehensive approach to prevent and address various forms of child abuse, neglect, exploitation, and violence that will be applied to all professionals and organization involved child welfare, including social workers, educators, healthcare providers, and law enforcement.
 - ii. **Prevention and Early Intervention Policy** Provision of early intervention and support services to at-risk families and giving emphasis to the importance of identifying and addressing risk factors for child abuse early, including poverty, substance abuse, and domestic violence, through community-based prevention programs.
 - iii. Access to Legal Protection Ensures that children are provided with legal support, including access to legal representation, child-friendly court procedures, and other legal protections to support their rights throughout the judicial process.
 - iv. Confidentiality and Information Sharing Policy The Municipality of Taytay shall be committed to upholding the confidentiality of all information related to child protection cases to safeguard the privacy, dignity, and safety of the children and families involved. All reports, investigations, and case files shall be treated with strict confidentiality and accessible only to authorized personnel directly involved in the case management process.

Social workers, as primary case managers, will have direct access to information necessary for the protection and welfare of children. Other parties involved, such as healthcare providers, law enforcement agencies, and legal representatives, must present a valid court order or an authorized letter from the appropriate authority to request access to confidential information.

- v. Monitoring and Evaluation Policy A secure, child-friendly, and confidential reporting system shall be established to encourage children, families, and community members to report cases of abuse, neglect, exploitation, and violence without fear of stigma or consequences. Procedures will ensure timely and appropriate responses, investigations, and support for victims.
- vi. After Care Program Policy After care services shall be provided upon thorough assessment to promote their emotional, educational, and social development, ensuring a smooth transition from care services.
- vii. Mandatory Child Protection Training Comprehensive and regular training sessions shall be mandatory for social workers, teachers, law enforcers, healthcare providers, and other parties involved in child welfare.
- viii. Integration of Child Protection Programs into Municipal Development Plans Child protection shall be a key component of the municipality's development agenda. This involves incorporating programs that promote child rights, strengthen child protection systems, and support holistic child development.
- ix. Child Protection Officer The Municipal Social Welfare and Development Office (MSWDO) will have the primary responsibility for overseeing the implementation and enforcement of the Child Protection Policy. The MSWDO, in collaboration with the Local Council for the

Protection of Children, will guide and assist all local entities involved in child protection efforts, ensuring that there is clear communication, shared responsibility, and efficient coordination in handling cases of child abuse, neglect, and exploitation.

- Funding for the Implementation of Programs and Services The X. Municipality of Taytay shall allocate the necessary funds for the execution of child protection programs and services.
- Separability Clause If any provision of this Ordinance is declared Section 4. invalid or unconstitutional, the remaining provisions shall not be affected and shall remain in full force and effect.
- Section 5. Repealing Clause - All ordinances, rules, and regulations inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.
- Section 6. Effectivity Clause - This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon approval and publication in a newspaper of general circulation or posting in at least three (3) conspicuous places within the Municipality of Taytay.
