WHEREAS, Section 16 of the Local Government Code of 1991 states that, “every local government unit shall exercise the power expressly granted, those necessarily implied there from, as well as powers necessary, appropriate, or incidental for its efficient and effective governance, and those which are essential to the promotion of the general welfare. Within their respective territorial jurisdictions, local government units shall ensure and support, among other things, the preservation and enrichment of culture, promote health and safety, enhance the right of the people to a balanced ecology, encourage and support the development of appropriate and self-reliant scientific and technological capabilities, improve public morals, enhance economic prosperity and social justice, promote full employment among their residents, maintain peace and order, and preserve the comfort and convenience of their inhabitants”;

WHEREAS, Section 17 (b)(2)(viii) of the Local Government Code of 1991 states that, “The infrastructure facilities intended primarily to service the needs of the residents of the municipality and which are funded out of municipal funds including, but not limited to, municipal roads and bridges; school buildings and other facilities for public elementary and secondary schools; clinics, health centers and other health facilities necessary to carry out health services; communal irrigation, small water impounding projects and other similar projects; fish ports, artesian wells, spring development, rainwater collectors and water supply systems; seawalls, dikes, drainage and sewerage, and flood control; traffic signals and road signs; and similar facilities”;

WHEREAS, Section 17 (f) of the Local Government Code of 1991 states that, “The national government or the next higher level of local government unit may provide or augment the basic services and facilities assigned to a lower level of local government unit when such services or facilities are not made available or, if made available, are inadequate to meet the requirements of its inhabitants”;

WHEREAS, the Municipality of Taytay is situated in low-lying floodplain near Laguna Lake, in particular Bangiad Creek located in Barangay San Juan receives substantial rainfall making it susceptible to flooding, causing damage to properties and disrupting the lives of residents;

WHEREAS, the Construction of Flood Control Interceptor at Bangiad Creek, Barangay San Juan, Taytay, Rizal is deemed necessary to mitigate flooding incidents in the area by intercepting stormwater discharge and directing it through a properly engineered drainage system, thereby preventing overflow, ensuring the safety and well-being of the community and reducing delays for commercial and business movement in the Municipality;

WHEREAS, the proposed Construction of Flood Control Interceptor at Bangiad Creek, Barangay San Juan, Taytay, Rizal is a huge undertaking that requires substantial amount of funds and intervention from the National Government through the Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH);

WHEREAS, the total estimated project cost for the said Flood Control Interceptor at Bangiad Creek, Barangay San Juan, Taytay, Rizal as per Detailed Engineering Plan is One Hundred Eighty-Eight Million Six Hundred Eighty-Two Thousand Three Hundred Thirty Pesos and Twenty-Four Centavos (Php 188,682,330.24);

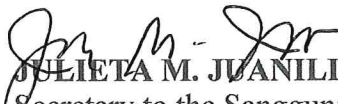
WHEREAS, the Sangguniang Bayan of Taytay thus humbly seeks understanding and support from the Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH) through the First District Representative of the Province of Rizal, Honorable Rebecca Maria “Mia” A. Ynares, to facilitate the immediate funding of the said Flood Control Interceptor at Bangiad Creek to address the severe and recurring flooding in the area ensuring a more developed, sustainable and safe Taytay in the Province of Rizal;

YNARES, TO ALLOCATE FUNDS FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF FLOOD CONTROL INTERCEPTOR AT BANGIAD CREEK LOCATED IN BARANGAY SAN JUAN, TAYTAY, RIZAL.
