WHEREAS, the fundamental law of local governance, Section 57 of the Local Government Code of 1991 (Republic Act No. 7160), mandates the Sangguniang Bayan to review ordinances approved by the Sangguniang Barangay to determine whether such acts are within the scope of their prescribed powers;

WHEREAS, the Sangguniang Barangay of Dolores has submitted for our review Ordinance No. 21, Series of 2025, which establishes clamping zones and traffic regulations within the vicinities of Dolores Elementary School, Corazon Aquino Elementary School, Taytay Elementary School, and Casimiro A. Ynares Sr. Memorial National High School;

WHEREAS, this Chamber previously held this matter in abeyance to subject the ordinance to a rigorous “strict scrutiny” test, specifically to resolve potential jurisdictional conflicts regarding the imposition of fines and the delegation of police power (clamping) which typically resides with the Municipality;

WHEREAS, this Committee acknowledges that the prior conflict, concerning the harmonization of Barangay fines with the existing Municipal Traffic Ordinances, has been effectively cured and corrected by the Sangguniang Barangay of Dolores dated August 18, 2025;

WHEREAS, the Municipal Public Safety Department (MPSD), through its Officer-in-Charge Atty. Justice Pajarillo, in a letter dated November 18, 2025, has rendered a statement that the office has “NO OBJECTION” to the subject ordinance and expressly certifies that “there is no conflict with existing Municipal Ordinances”;

WHEREAS, having examined the endorsement letter from Punong Barangay Reinier Andrew S. Pacleb dated November 12, 2025, and noting the urgency of traffic management in school zones, this Body finds the ordinance to be procedurally sound, substantively valid, and not ultra vires;


NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, as it is hereby resolved, by the 13th Sangguniang Bayan of Taytay, Rizal, in session duly assembled, to APPROVE AND DECLARE VALID BARANGAY DOLORES ORDINANCE NO. 21, SERIES OF 2025.

RESOLVED FURTHER, that the implementation of the “clamping” provision be strictly monitored to ensure due process is accorded to violators, specifically the three (3) hour redemption period provisioned in Section 6(b) of the ordinance, preventing any abuse of authority.


